#### Dear Team Bayview,

It's week 4 already! Time is flying by. We have been so lucky with the weather but it has created a few issues with some kids getting very tired (I know how hard it has been sleeping in this heat) and some children not drinking enough water and becoming dehydrated. This results in them becoming tired and cranky! We try to remind the children to drink lots of water throughout the day. It helps if they have their own drink bottle which can be refilled from our water fountains.

With this heat the children have become very creative with their play. We have a group who have decided sliding down the slope on cardboard was a great game. Yes we have had a few crashes but nothing serious thankfully. I have been really impressed that the children have been able to self regulate in this area and keep each other safe.

We have had two broken arms though. One of our children was climbing and swinging on the old soccer post after school and fell and broke her forearm. Thankfully mum and dad were there and alongside staff were able to get her to the doctor quickly. She is now is a cast having to cope with the heat! Another child was playing ninja and lost his balance resulting in him falling on his wrist which couldn't cope with the pressure and broke. He too is now in a cast having to cope with the heat! No more ninja games for him for a while!


