I know we have all been deeply affected by the tragedy that occurred in Christchurch last Friday. Although it was so far away our staff were quite concerned as we knew both Amy Craddock and Sarah Berquist, two of our ex staff members, were caught up in the lockdown. We are very pleased that although they are shaken, they are safe!

Lockdown procedures are employed where there is a potential danger to students and staff. Some of you may remember in 2017 when the NZ Police sent us into lockdown when an armed offender was trying to escape Police. Even though this person was not in or directly around the school the Police decided that it was a necessary precaution.

I have enclosed our lockdown procedures for your reference so you know what will happen should we be forced to go into lockdown in the future.

During a lockdown there is a signal which tells staff to take children inside, lock all doors and windows and to close all curtains and turn off lights. Children will be brought to the floor and movement will be kept to a minimum. This is to give the illusion to anyone outside that there is noone inside. This means that children will not be allowed to go to the bathroom and will have to toilet in a bucket. The children and teachers will need to stay like this until the all clear signal is given, usually by the Police.

If we are forced to go into lockdown during a break time all children will go to the school hall. Once in lockdown NO PARENT/ADULT will be given access to their child's class. This happened in 2017 where we had parents knocking on windows demanding entry and this sent the children into panic. DO NOT DO THIS!

If we are in lockdown I will let you know this via facebook and via text message as soon as it is practical to do so. Please know I will give priority to the children's safety over anything else.

If we are in lockdown it would make sense that you too as parents should go into lockdown and not stand outside. I suggest that if this happens that you go to the Bayview Community Centre as you will not get access to school buildings. A lockdown means there is imminent danger and standing in the carpark or wandering around the school will put your own safety at risk. We know you will want to get to your child but you will have to trust us and allow us and the police to do our jobs in this kind of situation.

I sincerely hope we never have to do this!

MOE NOTIFICATION REGARDING THE MEASLES OUTBREAK

There are currently measles outbreaks happening across the world, including here in New Zealand (Canterbury). We have had three cases this year in Auckland.

Measles is a serious disease and symptoms include a high fever, runny nose, cough and sore red eyes, followed by a rash starting behind the ears and spreading to the body a few days later. One in 10 people with measles need hospital treatment and the most serious cases can result in deafness or swelling of the brain.

If you are concerned that your child may be showing signs of this serious illness, please keep them home from school and call your doctor or Healthline on 0800 611 116. It's important to call first because measles is highly infectious and could infect others in the waiting room.

Students showing signs of illness should also be kept home from activities involving large groups of people such as school camps, sports events and performance festivals.
