PARENT INFORMATION EVENING WITH **KATHRYN BERKETT**

DEVICES AFFECTING SLEEP

We have recently had lots of parents talk to us about the difficulty they are having getting their children to sleep. We have heard that many children are on a device (ipad, computer, playstation, etc) right up until their bedtime. It takes 30-60 minutes for a child's brain to return to normal function after being on a device and children will not be able to sleep within this detox time. We strongly recommend you limit the time your child spends on these devices leading up to bedtime.
