#### Dear Team Bayview,

This is our first time sending out our newsletter via email. Just to make sure, we are also sending out a paper copy! We apologise for the OTT approach but we know that sometimes in the electronic world there are glitches!

As an enviroschool we are trying to reduce our environmental impact and we are also aware that sometimes the paper copy of the newsletter does not make it home. I have picked up lots of them from around the school or just outside the school on many an occasion!

#### **BELL TIMES**

We have moved some of our bell times. Our second break is now starting at 1pm (It used to be 1.10pm). We have also moved when the children eat as we found many students were not eating their kai (food), instead they were rushing off to play and then were really late back after playtime which was eating into their learning time. We have moved the eating part of each break to after the play time. The children are now eating all their food and are much calmer coming back into the classroom. We have told the children that they can eat their kai (food) at any time during the break if they are hungry as we recognise many students have their breakfast very early and go to before school care. Another outcome is that the children are eating all their food and some are wanting more. This may be seasonal with winter approaching but you may want to check with your child to see if they have enough food. Bell times are now: 9am - school starts

10am – brainfood break

- 10.45am children go out to play
- 11.10am children go back to class
- 11.15am children eat morning tea
- 11.25am second block of learning begins 1pm - children go to play
- 1.25pm children go back to class
- 1.30pm children eat their lunch
- 1.40pm last block of learning begins
- 3pm school finishes for the day

#### PARENT INFORMATION EVENINGS

We have two FREE events coming up to help support parents around building resilient children.

The first event is hosted by us at Bayview School. It is being run by Lynley Forde. Lynley is a specialist teacher with post graduate qualifications in education and psychology. She is co-founder of 2flourish, a North Shore based education company. Lynley will be talking about 'How to support your child to be a resilient, flourishing learner. Strengths based, positive parenting strategies and tools.' This event is on Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> May at 6pm in habitat 5.

The second event is hosted by the Kaipatiki Kahui Ako, of which we are a member. Kathryn is a mother of two adolescents, with a Masters of Educational Psychology. She will explain children's developmental stages and needs in simple, easy to understand language. Kathryn has been working in this area and training international audiences for over 16 years; working with groups such as Police, Teachers, Parents, Social Workers, NZ Rugby and many more. Kathryn is running two sessions:

5.30-7pm – the early years 5-9 year olds

7.30-9pm the adolescent years 10years +

These sessions will be held at Glenfield College on Wednesday 19th June 2019.

In January Kathryn spoke at our annual teachers' conference around building resilience in our students. Kathryn was inspirational, so much so, that the principals wanted to ensure that our community have an opportunity to hear Kathryn's messages. There are two different sessions depending on the age of your child/ren. Come to one or both!

### The Ear y Years 5-9 years

We all want our children and young ones to be able to make good decisions, to over-ride impulses and to be able to function in a socially acceptable way. These, in our own ways, are how we become good contributing citizens to our community. So how do we build the ability to do this? How do we help our children learn to operate in a way that will assist them throughout their lives, whatever bumps and waves come at them?

This neuroscience session, delivered in easy to understand language, will help you see how you can play a crucial role in developing this in your children. The information will show you how you can build resilience, encourage emotional intelligence and individually support them to experience and negotiate life. You will hear information that is so practical, you will be able to go home and use it straight away.

## avigating the Ado escent Years 10 years +

The adolescent years are an incredible time for change. So much is going on for our youth as they transition from children to adults. This session will outline the main changes that are physically happening in their brains and in their bodies. You will be amazed at what is going on, and it will make so much sense!

Understanding the changes, and how they affect our adolescents, will give you an increased ability to deal with the behaviour that results from them.
