Dear Team Bayview

We are so lucky to finally have some warm weather. We have noticed a number of children still wearing long sleeves under their polo shirts, or refusing to take their jumpers off in the middle of the day even though perspiration is pouring down their faces. Please remind your children to take off excess clothing and their jumper once the day has warmed up. As part of our sun safe policy at school all our children are required to wear a school bucket hat when they are outside during terms 1 and 4. We strongly encourage the children to apply sunscreen before school (mainly so parents can supervise this). We do have sunscreen available in the office for children to use but those who have sensitivity to certain sunscreens should provide their own. We do have a number of water fountains around the school that children can drink from or fill their drink bottles up at. We suggest your child brings a drink bottle to school so they can have this in class during learning time to have a drink from when needed. Please ensure everything is named so if it is misplaced it can be returned to the owner. On Monday I was able to return 10 hats that Mr Corbett had found around the school as they had the child's name written inside!

PROGRESS AND ACHIEVEMENT

Your child may have come home recently telling you that they had a test at school. This is because our teachers are currently assessing all students across all curriculum areas to determine their achievement and progress over the year. From this data the teachers will write an end of year report. These are being issued on Friday 13th December. On Thursday 28th November we are holding an open day where all parents are welcome to come into school so your children can share their learning with you. You are welcome to do this when you drop them off in the morning, or during the day before 3pm, if that suits. Please note these are child led and will not involve the teacher.

2020 RESPONSIBILITIES

We have some opportunities coming up where our 2019 Year 4 and 5 students can offer their service to the school for the 2020 academic year. Mrs Cray has already asked for expressions of interest in training for crossing patrol and chain gang. These children require official training by the NZ Police this year and once accepted and trained, will work alongside this years' monitors to gain valuable experience and courage!

We are also currently looking for our head boy and girl for 2020. These students must be Year 6 in 2020 and must 'want' to take on this position and all the responsibility that goes with it.

If you have a child in Year 4, 5 or 6 next year you may want to start the conversations around volunteering and leadership at Bayview in 2020.

Other responsibilities include librarians, student council, sports shed, kindy buddies, milk monitors, travelwise, enviorgroup, as well as extra curricula groups!

STUDENTS LEAVING/ENROLLING

If you are not returning to Bayview School next year can you please let us know? This will help us with our school organisation for 2020.

It will also be very helpful if all pre enrolment forms are completed for any students who live within the school zone and who will be attending Bayview during 2020, even if they are not starting until term 4. This helps us know when we may need to employ a new teacher for our new entrants.

If you applied for an out of zone place you should have received a letter from us by now telling you if you were successful or not with your application. If you have not received this please give Shannon a call in the office.
