Dear Team Bayview

Can you believe we are already 3 weeks into the academic year! We have had a fabulous start with very happy children and staff.

On Monday we held our official opening of the new school playground. We are so lucky to have Jerry Norman as our Kaumatua who conducted the blessing alongside his son and one of Bayview's BOT members, Brad Norman. It was a lovely ceremony where we lifted the tapu on the playground.

It took us three years to raise enough money from send it back to school. These fundraising to then be able to apply for a grant to were sent out on Monday 10th supplement the cost. Over three years as a community we raised \$60,000 so with the \$75,000 we received from the Lion Foundation we were able to get this project off the ground. The thing that makes this playground so special is that it was researched and designed by the children. In 2017 we had groups of children visiting playgrounds around Auckland. Their brief was to play on the playgrounds and photograph and document the pieces of equipment they liked the best. These groups then presented their findings to our Board of Trustees. We then got a group of students to work alongside an experienced playground designer and together they came up with a concept design. We then approached three playground companies and asked them to give us a design using our specifications and a quote. The children and community were then given the opportunity to vote for the design they liked the best and voila - we have our new playground.

It really has been a community project! Huge thanks to Michelle Webb who wrote the grant application to the Lion Foundation. Without her mahi this project would not have

Just so you know we have dedicated this playground for the use of Year 4-6 students during breaks. This is because the difficulty suits these age groups. Our younger classes will be able to play on this when they are supervised by an adult i.e. during class time or when you bring them up after school or on weekends. Having climbed up to the top tower I can tell you it is a bit scary and younger children will need supervision.

At Bayview School we offer a large range of extracurricular sports across all levels of the school. This is a special feature of our school. The wonderful Katrina Cray and Kirsten Stuckey are organising all sports for 2020. Thank you to the parents who are offering to coach and/or manage sports teams this year. We appreciate you as without this support we cannot offer these things. Thank you to those who attended the sports meeting on Monday 10th February. Some of the key messages from this

- This is Primary school sports not representative sports. Our aim is to allow players the opportunity to try a range of sports to determine their passions.
- Sports cannot be offered without parents offering to coach or manage teams.
- Players will need to wear a Bayview School sports uniform which can be purchased via EZlunch.
- Fees must be paid before your child can play.
- Parents are responsible for transporting their children to/from

OMMUNICATION

We use a variety of methods to try to communicate with parents about school activities and events. To access this you will need a QR code which your child's teacher can provide. You can also email staff and their email addresses are on our website.
