MEETINGS:

On Tuesday 12th April we will be Kia ora Team Bayview

I have recently attended (virtually) a range of meetings involving the Ministry of Education and Principal groups. After each meeting I have felt very grateful for the support given by our parents and wider community in keeping our children safe during these challenging times. I know many of you are getting tired and feeling a bit frayed by the increasing cases of Omicron and the extraordinary measures in place such as wearing a mask continually and being constantly aware of our personal space. It's hard, but I do appreciate that everyone is working together, no matter what their beliefs, to keep all our kids safe!

At Bayview we have had only 3 positive cases so far that have impacted classes. The parents in these classes have been contacted and under Phase 3 now only have to monitor for symptoms. All learners can attend onsite learning unless they are covid positive or are symptomatic. The majority of positive cases are coming from adults or older siblings not attending Bayview School. We have some children who are not currently attending school who are becoming infected because someone older has become infected within the household. School continues to be a safe place as long as everyone plays their part.

We do have a growing number of learners who are becoming household contacts. Just a reminder that under Phase 3 there are no longer 'close contacts' at school so you will not have to keep your child at home if there is a case in your child's class.

The following diagram may help you understand what is required if your household has a covid positive person and you have to self isolate:



Have you considered a plan for your household should someone test positive? Are you able to utilise different areas of your house? What measures could you put in place to try to stop the spread within your household? Potentially good questions to think about prior to any infection occuring.

Please keep letting us know if your child tests positive or if they are a Household contact as this helps us in our response.

BAYVIEW SCHOOL LOGO

Each newsletter I will share with you some of the meaning behind our new logo.

The Logo Rationale:

At the core of the Bayview School design is the incorporation of two main graphical elements that make up the logo. The Tohu (logo) is stylised to represent the natural surroundings, the community and the people.

The main design element is that of a stylised koru with a series of young koru shoots representing the many lwi and Hapu who occupied the area in the past. The Koru unfurls into a silhouette of two children. These elements together represent growth, achievement and guardianship.

There are three Key colour schemes for the corporate identity, namely Violet, Cyan Blue and Dark Blue. These colours give the graphic its grounding or foundation, so as to suggest trust and stability.
